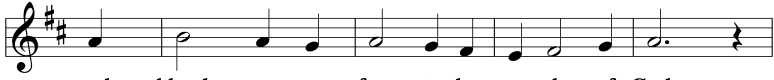

Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of






