He has given help to Israel, His servant, in remembrance of His mercy, as He spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.


Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.


Prayer of the Day




