Dear Immanuel Lutheran Church,

Because of COVID and many other reasons, I had not been to my student mailbox since before Christmas and so just retrieved your card and gift from the mailbox and I am ve4y grateful and appreciative of you all! Just receiving a Christmas card in the mail means a great deal, but your gift that is already in addition to your support through the Adopt-A Student program is above and beyond and I can't say thank you enough!

Life at the seminary has been busy! I have preached once n March already and by the end of the month will have preached three times this month (this is in addition to sermons written for two classes), and it has been really exciting.
