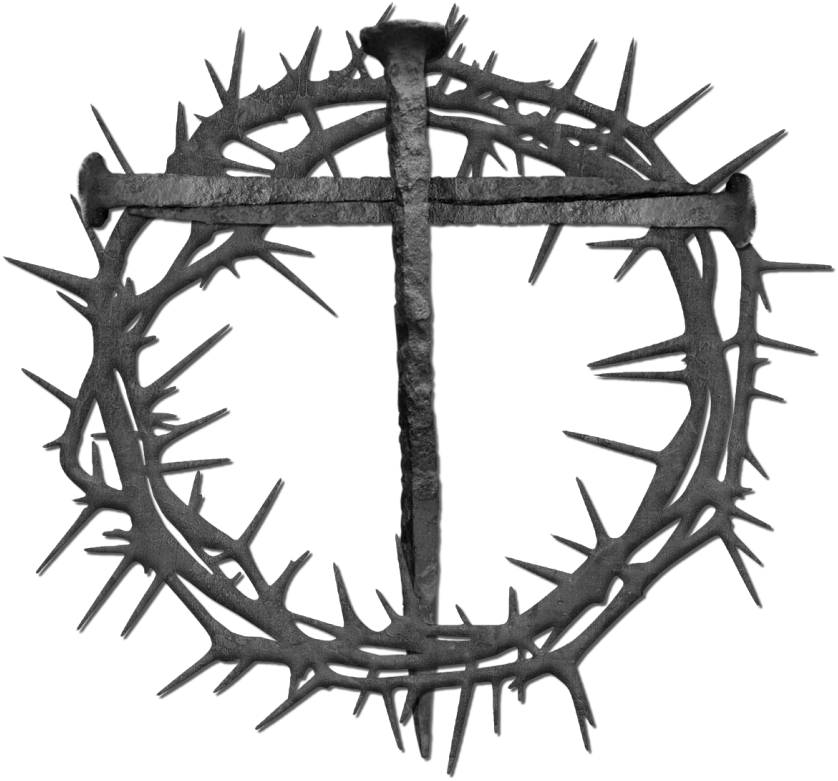

Colossians 1:13–22

¹³He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us
to the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the
forgiveness of sins.

¹⁵He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation.

¹⁶For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and
invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things
were created through him and for him. ¹⁷And he is before all things, and
in him all things hold together. ¹⁸And he is the head of the body, the
church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything
he might be preeminent. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased

to dwell, ²⁰and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

²¹And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²²he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him,
