

Midweek Lent 3: Sloth and Diligence

**As We Gather:** Today we continue our sermon series "Glittering Vices," reflecting on the vice of sloth, as we observe the disciples falling asleep in the garden of Gethsemane, unable to watch with our Lord even a single hour. We too are lazy in embracing the good work of the kingdom of God. But, when we develop diligence, we learn to passionately embrace the tasks which God sets before us.

## + Invocation and Call to Worship +

- P Lord, as we begin this Lenten journey together,
- Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the Founder and Perfecter of our faith.
- P Who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross
- and scorning its shame, is now seated at the right hand of the Father.
- P As we reflect on your life, passion, and death
- C Let your virtuous example be cultivated within us.
- P Send the power of your spirit into our hearts
- That we might joyfully live out your commands in every aspect of our lives.



# + Confession and Forgiveness +

Let us confess our sin to God our Father in heaven, pleading for His mercy for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ:

- Father, forgive me for evil thoughts that come from within me, out of my unclean heart. (Mark 7:21-22)
- **P** Lord have mercy.
- Father, forgive my gluttonous heart, which attempts to live by bread alone and not by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. (*Matt. 4:4*)
- **P** Lord have mercy.
- Father, forgive my greedy heart, which seeks security in the abundance of possessions at the expense of my neighbor in need. (Luke 12:15)
- **P** Lord have mercy.
- Father, forgive my prideful heart, which displaces You as rightful Lord instead of being Your humble servant. (Matt. 20:26, Phil. 2:3-7, James 6:4-10)
- **P** Lord have mercy.
- Father, forgive my slothful heart, which is indifferent to Your Word and disregards the good works You have prepared for me to walk in. (*Eph. 2:10, Matt. 25:31-46*)
- **P** Lord have mercy.
- Father, forgive my envious heart, which begrudges Your generosity to others and finds joy in their sorrow. (Matt. 20:15)
- P Lord have mercy.
- ☑ Father, forgive my angry heart, which does not produce the righteousness You desire but avenges injustice through hatred of my enemies. (Matt. 5:22, Rom. 12:19, James 1:20)
- P Lord have mercy.
- C Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.
- P Jesus Christ was delivered over to death for your trespasses and raised for your justification. He gives you a new heart and puts a new Spirit within you. He removes your heart of stone and gives you a heart of flesh. Your sins are forgiven, go in peace. Amen. (Rom. 4:25, Ezek. 36:26)

P Let us pray.

O God, whose strength is made perfect in weakness, mortify and kill all vices in us and so strengthen us by your grace that by the innocence of our lives and the constancy of our faith, even unto death, we may glorify your holy name; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.

### + Scripture Readings +

#### **Old Testament Reading:**

#### Deuteronomy 6:1–9

<sup>1</sup>"Now this is the commandment, the statutes and the just decrees that the LORD your God commanded me to teach you, that you may do them in the land to which you are going over, to possess it, <sup>2</sup>that you may fear the LORD your God, you and your son and your son's son, by keeping all his statutes and his commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be long. <sup>3</sup>Hear therefore, O Israel, and be careful to do them, that it may go well with you, and that you may multiply greatly, as the LORD, the God of your fathers, has promised you, in a land flowing with milk and honey.

<sup>4</sup>"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. <sup>5</sup>You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. <sup>6</sup>And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. <sup>7</sup>You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. <sup>8</sup>You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. <sup>9</sup>You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

#### **Epistle Reading:**

<sup>6</sup>Now we command you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you keep away from any brother who is walking in idleness and not in accord with the tradition that you received from us. <sup>7</sup>For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us, because we were not idle when we were with you, <sup>8</sup>nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you. <sup>9</sup>It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an

example to imitate. <sup>10</sup>For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. <sup>11</sup>For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. <sup>12</sup>Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

<sup>13</sup>As for you, brothers, do not grow weary in doing good. <sup>14</sup>If anyone does not obey what we say in this letter, take note of that person, and have nothing to do with him, that he may be ashamed. <sup>15</sup>Do not regard him as an enemy, but warn him as a brother.



#### **Gospel Reading:**

#### Matthew 26:36-46

<sup>36</sup>Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." <sup>37</sup>And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. <sup>38</sup>Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with me." <sup>39</sup>And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will." <sup>40</sup>And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping. And he said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with me one hour? <sup>41</sup>Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." <sup>42</sup>Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done." <sup>43</sup>And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. <sup>44</sup>So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again. <sup>45</sup>Then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. <sup>46</sup>Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."
