OPENING SENTENCES excerpts from Hebrews 9 NLT, 4 ESV

- P Christ has now become the High Priest over all the good things that have come.
- With his own blood he entered the Most Holy Place once for all time and secured our redemption forever.
- **P** For Christ did not enter into a holy place made with human hands.
- He entered into heaven itself to appear now before God on our behalf.
- P He did not enter heaven to offer himself again and again.
- Once for all time, he has appeared at the end of the age to remove sin by his own death as a sacrifice.
- P Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God,
- **C** let us hold fast our confession.
- P For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses,
- **©** but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin.
- P Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace,
- that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
